

MISSION, VISION, GUIDING PRINCIPLES

MISSION

To train Navy Medical Department personnel and Religious Program personnel in the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to serve with and support the Marine Corps.

VISION

COMMANDING OFFICER'S GUIDANCE

Guiding Principle #4: We are committed to maintaining high standards of behavior, personal conduct and professionalism.



2. We will not tolerate hazing, discrimination, harassment or other negative or abusive behaviors.


3. We will live by and teach the fundamental tenets and ethos of Naval Service: Honor, Courage and Commitment.

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
STRATEGIC THEMES AND INITIATIVES

Field Medical Training Battalion – East exemplifies excellence in training.

The primary purpose of Field Medical Training Battalion, as stated in our mission statement, is “To train Hospital Corpsmen personnel and Religious Program personnel in the knowledge, skills and abilities necessary to serve with and support the Marine Corps”. This requires a professional and quality staff to provide the instruction and mentoring necessary for our students to ensure they are proficient in the required skills and knowledge. Platoon advisor and instructors will be hand selected, carefully interviewed and fully prepared to train students to be mentally and physically equipped to support the Marine Corps operating forces. FMTB-East will continue to evaluate and partner with FMTB-West, our sister services, and civilian entities to expand our capabilities and incorporate challenging and appropriate training into our Programs of Instruction (POI). Instructors will strive to achieve Master Training Specialist (MTS) status while assigned to FMTB-East; MTS designation ensures the highest standards for instructors which further enhances the transfer of knowledge to the student population.

Field Medical Training Battalion – East seizes the advantage in utilizing emerging technology.

FMTB-East will incorporate the best and most appropriate technology into its POI to help student s better prepare for service with the operating forces of the Marine Corps. This will include but not limited to Combat Trauma Simulators (manikins), computer based learning opportunities, and other technologies that will assist the student in his preparation to save lives on the battlefield.



STRATEGIC THEMES AND INITIATIVES

Field Medical Training Battalion – East continuously evaluates resources and equipment requirements. The staff of FMTB-East will regularly identify training needs and requirements for appropriate budget considerations or to be included in Program Objective Memorandum (POM) initiatives for out-year planning. Assets currently on hand will be appropriately maintained in order to ensure the maximum lifespan of equipment.

Field Medical Training Battalion – East aggressively pursues student housing refurbishment. Quality of life is paramount to sustained and effective training. The current barracks for the student population have undergone renovation in the past several years and we must ensure that barracks remain in habitable condition. FMTB-East will maintain a constant program to ensure that all equipment (beds, lockers, washers/dryers, televisions, etc) are operable and functioning. Maintenance of the building and associated infrastructure will be constantly assessed and any requests for repairs or enhancements will be forwarded to the Area Commander.


STRATEGIC THEMES AND INITIATIVES

Field Medical Training Battalion – East will continue to maintain appropriate number of trained instructors to support the program of instruction. Instructor Training shall include:

Martial Arts Instructor Training. In order to meet the requirements of increased training, FMTB-East will track the number of qualified Martial Arts Instructors and schedule qualified staff members for training as MAI.

Marksmanship Coaches. To meet the requirements directed by higher authority, FMTB-East will organize and coordinate the scheduling of staff Marines and Sailors to be trained as Marksmanship Coaches.

Tactical Vehicle Operators. In order to support training, leaders will ensure sufficient numbers of HMMWV drivers are trained to support field evolutions, road marches, and physical fitness training. All E-5 and below personnel in the Battalion will be trained to drive HMMWV (without exception).
